

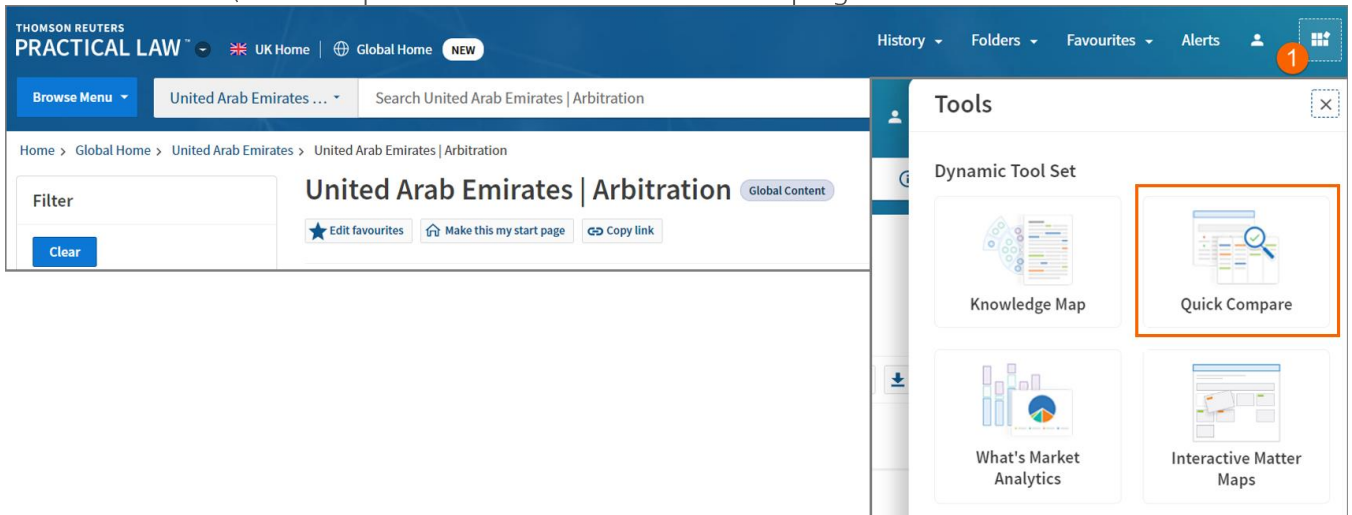

Using Quick Compare within the Dynamic Tool Set

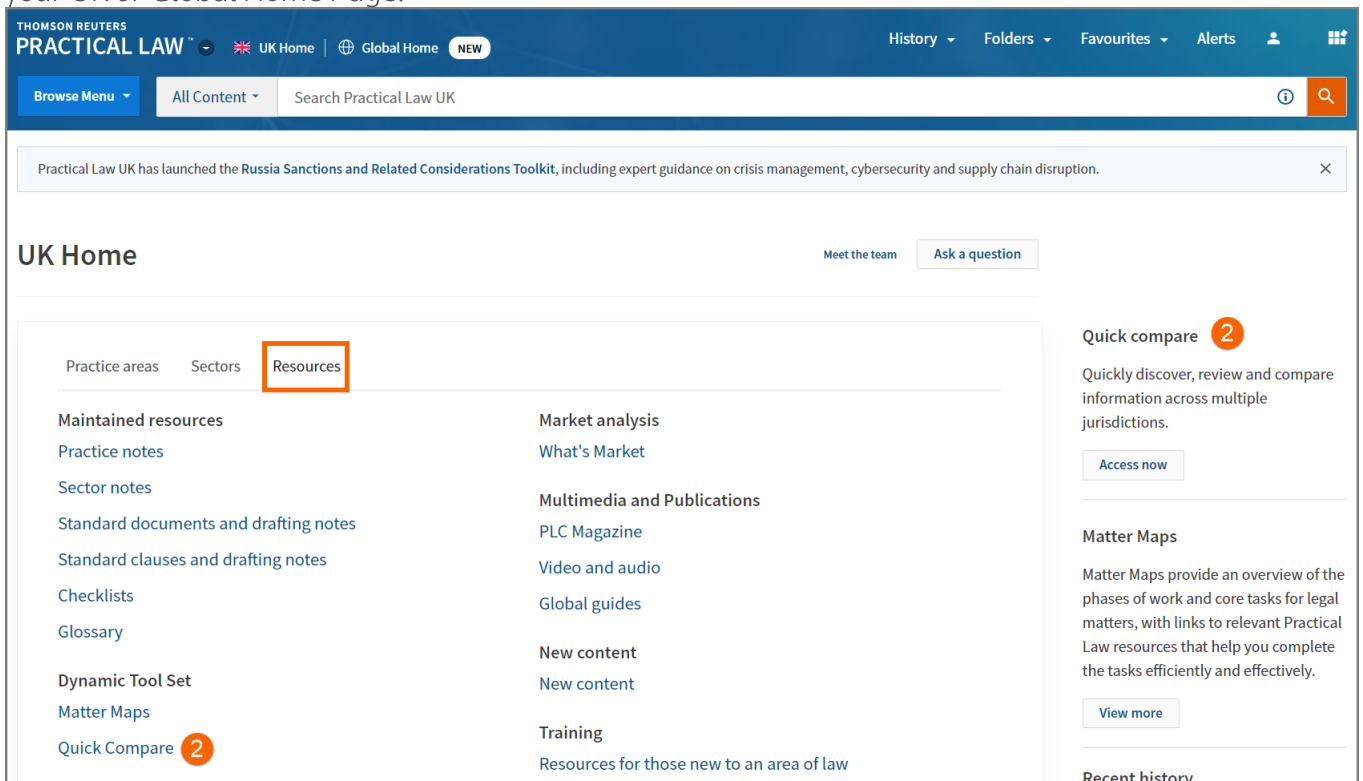
With the Quick Compare tool on Thomson Reuters Practical Law™ you can build customisable comparison charts across Practical Law's Global Content. The Quick Compare tool is part of the Thomson Reuters Dynamic Tool Set and access thereto is dependent on your subscription type.

Accessing Quick Compare

1. You can access Quick Compare in the Tools Centre at the top right-hand corner.

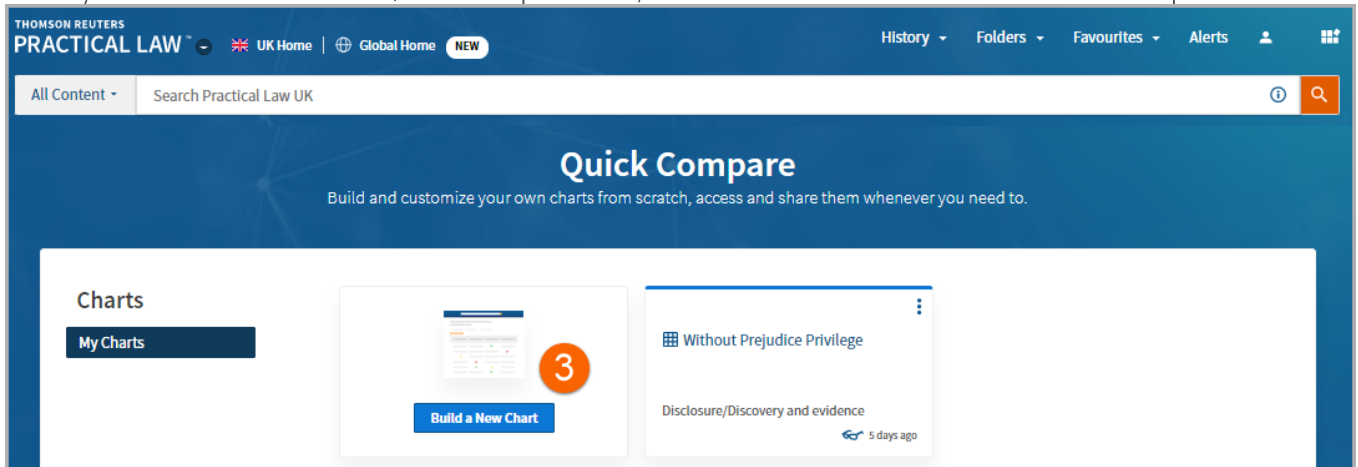


2. You can also access Quick Compare under your UK Home page Resources, or on the right-hand side of your UK or Global Home Page.

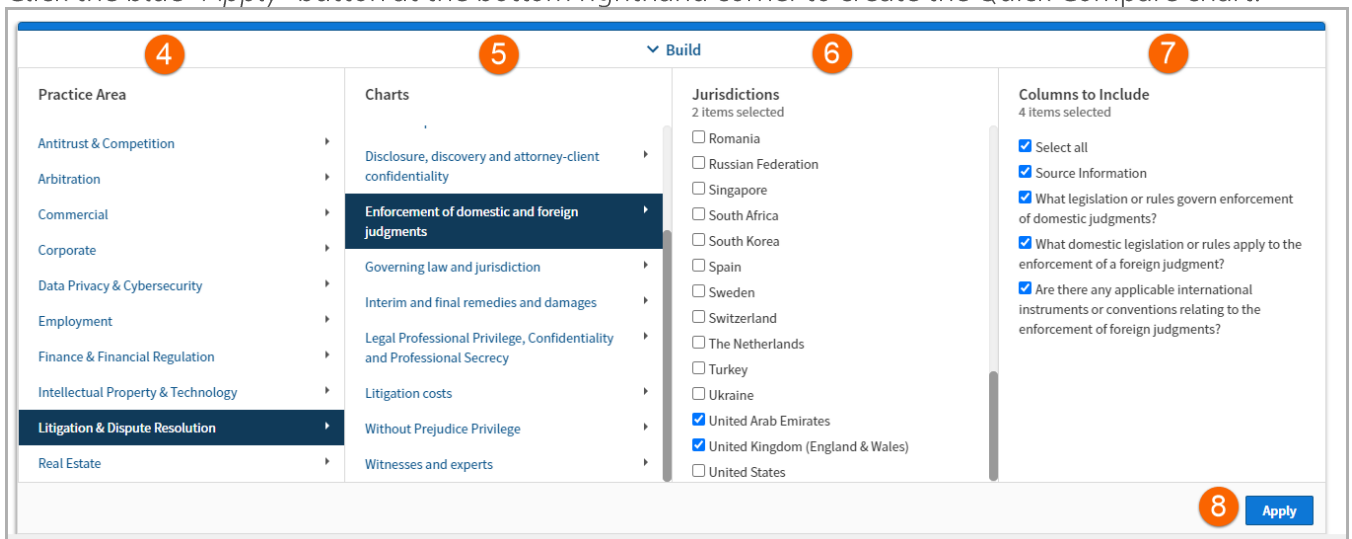


Navigating the Quick Compare Tool

3. Once you have accessed the Quick Compare tool, click “Build a New Chart” to build a comparative chart.



4. Select your Practice Area from the first column. For example, “Litigation & Dispute Resolution”.
5. Select your Topic from the second chart column. For example, “Enforcement of domestic and foreign judgments”.
6. Select one or more jurisdictions from the third chart column. For example, the United Kingdom and the United Arab Emirates.
7. Select one or more parameters from the fourth chart column to include in the comparison.
8. Click the blue “Apply” button at the bottom righthand corner to create the Quick Compare chart.



9. Your chart will then display.
10. The “Source Information” column provides you with the details of the Practical Law Resource where the answers are obtained.
11. To view greater details for each answer, click on the blue expander symbol in the top righthand corner of each grid block in the chart.
12. Alternatively, to view all details, click the detail dropdown menu at the top righthand of the chart and select “more detail” to expand all details.
13. Your document delivery options are located at the top righthand of the chart. You can create a hyperlink to the Chart, download, or print the Chart.
14. To edit the Chart, click on the “Customize” banner at the bottom of the page.
15. Your Chart is automatically saved to the Quick Compare landing page.
