

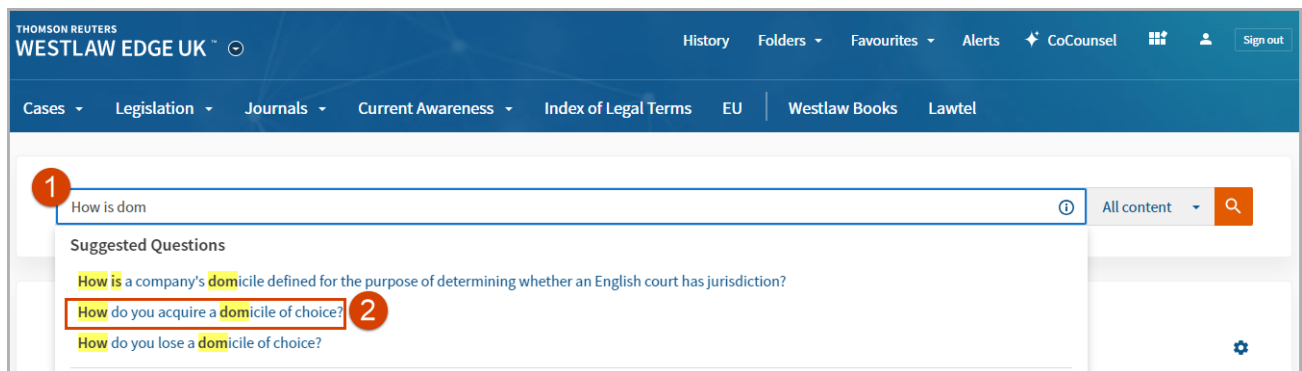


Westlaw Questions

This guide provides information on how to use Westlaw Questions on Westlaw Edge UK.

Using Westlaw Questions

1. Begin by typing search terms into the search box located on the Home Page of Westlaw Edge UK. Westlaw Edge UK will suggest potential questions that you might be trying to answer.
2. Click on the Westlaw Question relevant to your search query.



3. An editorially selected answer to the selected Westlaw Question will be displayed. This answer is derived from Westlaw Edge UK's cases, dictionaries, and/or overview articles.
4. To toggle the visibility of the Westlaw Question and response, click on the circumflex icon located in the top right-hand corner of the screen.
5. Click on "Edit search" to modify the search, if required.
6. Click on the quoted text to navigate directly to the specific passage within the resource.
7. Click on the resource title, to access the start of the resource document.
8. Below the Westlaw Question and response, additional search results relevant to the question are listed.
9. Click on "View more" to expand the Westlaw Question responses list, when available.
